




The Samoan Creation Legend.










Lane Way Tunnel - Long Section



Nature of the land (the people) are the imprinted leaves within the glass. Also the woven green leaves on the poles to give structure of nature in this dark setting of the Laneway.









Material Samoan Mahogany Hardwood roof with steel bars with traditional Samoan weave of coconut rope. The rope is created by weaving strains together to make rope and its colour. The windows are framed in palm wood and the lift in raw coconut tree wood and fine mat shades. The windows are fibreglass with green coconut leave prints.















ATMOSPHERIC GROUND FLOOR PLAN









ATMOSPHERIC LONG SECTION




Long Section: Large Atmospheric
